Food Security Situation*

•The October and November harvests are improving food availability, although food prices are higher than 2010 prices and this year's harvest is expected to be below-normal due to the poor distribution of rainfall at critical stages of crop growth.

• UNDP Human Development Index ranked Haiti 145 of 169 countries surveyed in 2010. Extreme poverty, social instability, and recurring natural disasters combine to make Haiti the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere.

• Haiti imports approximately 50% of its food, demonstrating a strong dependence on the international market. In addition to the global rise in fuel and grain prices, the food security of the most vulnerable is further challenged by social and political unrest.
