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Food Security Situation*

- Needs are expected to be high until mid-to late-October 2012, during the dry period before the start of the October to December short rains, particularly in the southeastern and coastal marginal agricultural lowlands and in the southeastern pastoral areas.

- The overall food insecure population is likely to increase from 2.2 million to at least 2.4 million people in August, as the lean season intensifies.

- Due to a predicted El Niño in the region, the 2012 short rains are expected to be above average. This should impact positively on livelihoods in the agro-pastoral and pastoral areas, as well as the marginal agricultural lowlands.

- Enhanced rains between November and December, particularly in the northeastern pastoral areas, may result in damaged or flooded transport infrastructure, impeding access to markets and delivery of humanitarian interventions during that period. Food prices may be negatively affected as well by pre- and post-harvest maize crop losses as a result of flooding in key growing areas.
