Food Security Situation

- Natural disasters such as cyclones, droughts, and floods pose the greatest threat to Madagascar's food security. Over the past 35 years, more than 50 natural disasters have struck, affecting more than 11 million people. Most recently, an estimated 259,000 people were affected by Cyclone Giovanna. Poor health and nutrition practices, low education levels, and locust infestations also threaten the country's food security.
- Madagascar is an underdeveloped low-income, food-deficit country with extreme poverty where more than 50 percent of children are stunted. The country has dropped to 151 out of 187 countries in the 2011 UNDP Human Development Index.
- Food production is very low with pervasive food insecurity is in the South and Southeast due to frequent cyclones, flooding and droughts. Food insecurity is traditionally most pronounced from October to March.


