Food Security Situation*

- Food insecurity in Pakistan is largely a problem of economic access by the poorest and most vulnerable to an adequate, diverse diet, and is exacerbated by militancy and natural disasters.

- The monsoon rains of August 2011 caused flooding in Sindh and Balochistan Provinces. WFP has assisted some 3.5 million flood-victims and is now shifting to food-for-work and cash-for-work activities to help meet emergency food needs while restoring community infrastructure, particularly drainage structures.

- WFP continues to provide early recovery support such as food for work, targeted nutritional assistance, and school feeding to populations in the areas heaviest hit by the July and August 2010 and 2011 monsoon flooding.

- WFP is providing food assistance to IDPs and returnees impacted by the
