Food Security Situation*

- The Philippines is considered a disaster-prone country with an estimated 20 typhoons annually, of which approximately five are expected to cause major damage, along with the potential for floods and landslides.
- Natural disasters increase the number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) and worsen the already squalid living conditions of the displaced. UNHCR estimates there are over 100,000 IDPs in the Philippines.
- WFP estimates that 30 percent of the population in the conflict-affected areas are food insecure and are skipping meals, reducing portion size, and otherwise resorting to coping mechanisms that pose risks to their lives.
